Merrick, a pioneer of B2B e-comnerce, founded webMethods in 1996 with Caren DeWitt and

Charles Allen. A leader in B2B integration, the company designs software to help businesses do business over the Internet by allowing computer systems to 'talk' to each other, regardless of the software each is using.

For the first two years, Merrick was unable to attract venture capital because information technology had not yet become fashionable. With the company's bank account down to \$31, their savings drained and all their credit cards at the limit, the company flirted with bankruptcy before being saved by a last-minute injection of venture capital.

Since then, Merrick has gone on to grow his company from a three-person team to more than 600 employees with a roster of blue-chip customers such as FedEx, Citibank, and Dell Computer.
